international political theory ipt focuses on the point where two fields of study meet international relations and political theory it takes from the former a central concern with the international broadly defined from the latter it takes a broadly normative identity ipt studies the ought questions that have been ignored or side lined by the modern study of international relations and the international dimension that political theory has in the past neglected a central proposition of ipt is that the domestic and the international cannot be treated as self contained spheres although this does not preclude states and the states system from being
